ordered (waiting time is two weeks) and to complete other required jobs according to an architect's plans (Copa Montalbano Architects). This project will be covered by the Central Diocese as part of Enlivening Program for the parishes in our diocese. Please slow down and be careful traveling into the parish parking lot passing the work site. Thank you for your cooperation.

Before we can install a stairlift connecting the church and the parish hall, we need to fulfill Woodland Park Planning Board code requirements – the installation of a new emergency exit door in the parish hall. We hired L. Zeneli Construction LLC.

The work began on Friday, August 16, 2024. The excavation of the soil is complete, gravel spread and the retaining wall is in the final stage. The pipes from the gutters were installed and connected to the water basin. It will take about two more weeks to finish this project with a new exit door which was



The roof on our 50 year old garage had leaks and needed to be repaired.

This past week August 18-25, 2025 the new shingles replaced the old ones

and new gutters were installed by Szwarc Construction Inc. The church roof gutters were covered with rust resistant gutters guards. The project did cost \$7,800 plus \$450 for additional plywood and gutters guards for the church and part of the rectory.
