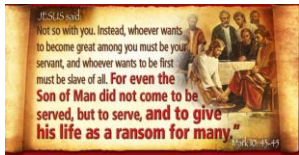

human lot, to transform all things with his submission to the will of the Father. His message to his disciples is clear: If you want to follow me, you must be a servant to all.

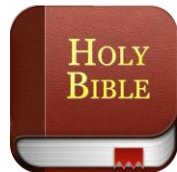

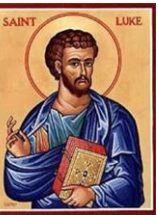

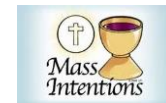
HOLY CROSS PARISH DAILY PRAYER CHAIN

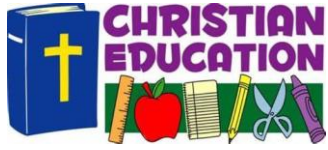
