





A custom in homes of many countries including Austria, Czech Republic, Slovakia, Germany, Hungary, Poland, and Sweden is to inscribe above the front doors the letters C † M † B, placing a cross between each letter. This is done every year on January 6, Epiphany, commemorating the wisemen being led by the star to the manger. The legendary names of the Magi were Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar. Many people interpret the three letters as the initials of those names. In reality these letters originate from the Latin phrase "Christus Mansem Benedicat" (May Christ bless this home). This religious custom expresses the belief that the Lord remains with His people throughout the year

ST. BLAISE BLESSING OF THE THROATS HOLY MASS ON February 2, 2025 will conclude with St. Blaise Blessing of the Throat.

St. Blaise's Story — In 1222, the Council of Oxford prohibited servile labor in England on Blaise's feast day. The Germans and Slavs hold him in special honor, and for decades many United States Catholics have sought the annual St. Blaise blessing for their throats. We know that Bishop Blaise was martyred in his episcopal city of Sebastea, Armenia, in 316. The legendary "Acts of St. Blaise" were written 400 years later. According to them, Blaise was a good bishop, working hard to encourage the spiritual and physical health of his people. During persecution in Armenia, Blaise was forced to flee to live as a hermit in solitude and prayer. He made friends with the wild animals. One day a group of hunters seeking wild animals stumbled upon Blaise's cave. They were surprised and frightened. The bishop was kneeling in prayer surrounded by patiently waiting wolves, lions and bears. The legend has it that as the hunters hauled Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise's command the child was able to cough up the bone. Agricolaus, governor of Cappadocia, tried to persuade Blaise to worship pagan idols. Blaise refused; he was martyred. Saint Blaise is the Patron Saint of throat ailments.
